Global Eco Asia-Pacific Tourism Conference, the premier event of Ecotourism Australia, will be held 2-4 December 2019 in Cairns, Queensland, Australia. In 2019 Global Eco Asia-Pacific focuses on the evolving role of ecotourism with a special focus on ecotourism in World Heritage sites; Indigenous ecotourism enterprises; and the emerging issue of overtourism.



So often described as a 'niche' part of the industry, and yet now representing



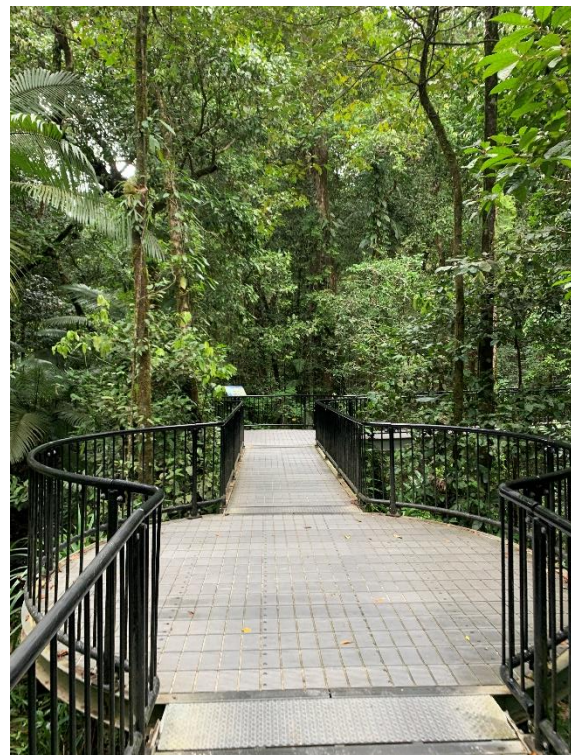
an estimated 25% of the Australian tourism industry. The Great Barrier Reef alone represents an economic, social and icon asset value of \$56 billion. It supports 64,000 jobs and contributes \$6.4 billion to the Australian economy' (Deloitte, Access Economics, 2017). The Wet Tropic of Queensland World Heritage Area similarly contributes to the North Queensland and Australian economy in a significant

way. Ecotourism is the standard bearer for sustainable tourism and is being embraced by the mainstream industry.

Ecotourism is also the natural home for high value experienced travellers.

Global Eco Asia-Pacific brings together the key players that can evolve this critical sector of the tourism industry – the operators, protected area managers, destination developers, applied researchers and destination marketers.

Within the Asia-Pacific ecotourism represents the ideal vehicle to achieve poverty alleviation, community involvement and environmental sustainability. Within Australia ecotourism offers regional and remote communities a vital tool for economic development.

### Guidelines for offering a paper



Global Eco is not an academic conference. It is predominantly attended by practitioners in ecotourism operations, protected area management agencies and tourism organisations. A review of the papers from previous years will assist in pitching your paper. [CLICK HERE](#) to view previous papers.

#### **Submitted papers must address the following:**

- an alignment with the topics listed;
- in the presentation of case studies, an outline of the key learnings and outcomes of the project or program;
- applied learning experiences of the project and their relevance to ecotourism and responsible tourism;

#### **Further requirements:**

- submissions must be made electronically via the Global Eco Conference website 'call for papers' tab;
- abstracts must be no more than 250 words;
- abstracts should contain a brief summary of the content areas of your proposed topic;
- indication if you are also happy for your paper to be considered in the keynote program;
- joint presentations are welcome;
- please provide a 150 word biography (and a medium to high resolution head and shoulders photo) of yourself; and
- the title should aim to be precise and concise so that it conveys a clear message.



All presenters must be able to cover their own registration fees, accommodation and travel costs. Accepted speakers will be offered a 10% discount on registration fees. The discount excludes accommodation, networking events and technical tours, as these activities are charged at cost price.

Accepted speakers must register and pay prior to **COB, Friday, 13 September 2019** to have their paper confirmed and published online.

To enable delegates to interact with presenters we encourage speakers to attend the entire conference. As a minimum, speakers must be registered and attend the day of their presentation.

The titles of papers and presenter's details will be provided (excluding contact details) on the conference website. The Secretariat reserves the right to edit the title of papers to reduce their length if required. Any Author changes to the title or abstract of papers must be provided to the Global Eco Secretariat by email prior to **COB, Friday 13 September 2019**.

Speakers with accepted abstracts will be required to prepare and submit their full presentation by **COB, Friday, 15 November 2019**.
